changing the way the academic year is shaped (quarter system, etc)

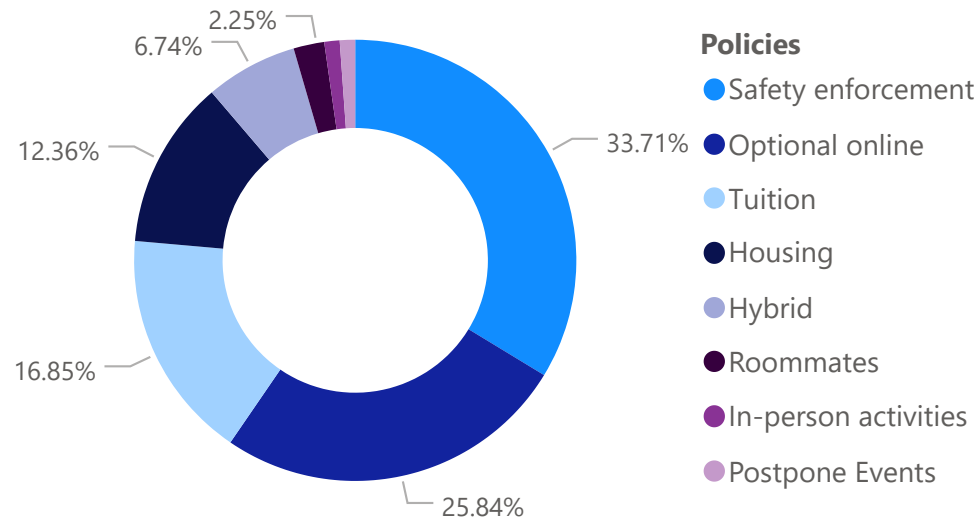
